She always has an unyielding spirit for all the things that Monica did. She had been engaged in catering service, such as a waiter, chef and food critic. She became a senior western chef at last just for the purpose of having a place in the restaurant. But all she had done changed the attitudes of her parents. Phoebe's experience was the most ups and downs; she had been a bucker, a driver, a secretary as well as a permanent masseur. Her work was not as successful as other friends, but she was always optimistic and independent. Joey was the typical of non-Cuban and non- big names actors. He had been keen to show and to fame. Although Rose had always stressed that he was in the case of breaking up after making "derailed", Rachel insisted that they did not break up. So Rachel cannot forgive Ross betrayal during their relationship subsisting. Thereafter, they cannot be together in six years. This shows that Americans are almost loyal to each other once they have built relationship with each other (Li, 2007).
